Details of the following request for an overnight conference will be presented for discussion at the August 8th Directors' Study Forum meeting. Participation in this overnight conference is being requested by Dr. Joseph Intrieri, Middle School Principal.

Conference Title: Pennsylvania Principal Conference Lead 22

Conference Location: Kalahari Resorts & Convention Center - Poconos, Pennsylvania

Conference Dates: Saturday, October 15 – Tuesday, October 18, 2022

Dr. Intrieri will complete online activities prior to the scheduled conference, including "Research-Based Instruction, Supervision and Evaluation Strategies to Improve Student Learning" and "Transforming Student and Teacher Learning through the EdCamp Model."

Attendance and participation in the October conference is intended to be the culmination of all online activities and will allow school leaders to reflect on key concepts from the activities. The conference will also allow school leaders to make connections with their respective school settings and create their own action plan and administrative performance goal. Attendance at the Pennsylvania Principal Conference Lead 22 will provide PIL Credit Hours as required for administrative personnel under Act 45.

The estimated costs for this overnight conference, totaling \$1,433, are a budgeted item in the 2022-2023 Middle School Office of the Principal/Workshops & Conferences account, and include the online sessions fee of \$400, conference registration of \$285, hotel room (for three nights) of \$501, estimated mileage at \$173, and a maximum reimbursement for meals of \$74.

SUBJECT: Board Policy Considerations / August 2022

The District's Policy Maintenance Agreement with PSBA includes receipt of periodic newsletters suggesting review of specific policies that may be impacted by legislative changes. PSBA has provided suggested language to consider when making updates to the policies listed below and are presented for review and discussion during the August 8, 2022, Directors' Study Forum. Rationale and a brief description behind suggested revisions are included. Respective administrators will be present at the meeting to provide additional information, if/as needed. Stock and Leader has reviewed the proposed revisions and provided appropriate guidance before presenting suggested changes to board members. Revisions are noted in bold or colored font, strikethrough, or a combination.

1) *Policy No. 218: Student Discipline

Language regarding off-campus activities was revised to clarify the circumstances under which the Code of Student Conduct and board policy apply to student behavior that occurs on and off-campus. In addition to revisions to the off-campus activities language, Policy 218 was updated to include language on reports to the threat assessment team, as well as the option of including restorative practices to address violations of the Code of Student Conduct. SGASD Board Policy 218 had last been updated in 2007; the draft policy presented for review includes PSBA's recommended language, with additional highlighted revisions from the solicitor.

2) *Policy No. 220: Student Expression/Dissemination of Materials

The title of Policy 220 includes a title change from Student Expression/Distribution and Posting of Materials to Student Expression/Dissemination of Materials, with minor terminology and section headings coinciding. The policy now defines dissemination as distribution AND posting. The policy was also revised to more clearly outline instances of student expression that would be subject to the limitations, prohibitions, and requirements of policy. New language addresses the training of staff involved as they review requests for dissemination of nonschool materials to ensure understanding of evaluation processes and limitations on school officials' authority to regulate off-campus student expression. The draft policy presented for review includes PSBA's recommended language, with additional revisions included from the solicitor.

3) *Policy No. 227: Controlled Substances/Paraphernalia

The off-campus activities section in this policy has been removed and, in its place, now refers to Policy 218, Student Discipline, which is where school administrators will be directed when considering consequences for a student's conduct that occurred off school property or during nonschool hours.

4) *Policy No. 237: Electronic Devices

The off-campus activities section of this policy was removed, and, in its place, now refers to Policy 218, Student Discipline. The definition has been updated and Telephone Pagers/Beepers section has been removed to remain current with technology used in educational settings.

*According to recent case law, school administrators must articulate in detail the nature and

extent of disruption to or interference with the school environment thought to be caused by on or off-campus student expression or conduct and the specific manner by which the student expression or conduct involved is thought to have caused it. As a district, we will continue to consult with our solicitor when developing and enforcing student handbooks, codes of conduct, board policies and other rules related to off-campus speech and conduct.

5) Policy No. 913.4: Nonschool Organizations/Groups/individuals

Highlights of changes include updating previous terms "distribution and posting" to "dissemination," expanding the definition of nonschool materials, changing "nicotine" to "vaping products," and updating the language of limitations on dissemination. Revisions also include a reference to the social media policy, adopted by the Board in February 2022.

Following initial review and discussion and the August 8th Directors' Study Forum, the Board will be asked to consider approval of a first reading at the August 22nd Regular Voting Meeting, with a second and final reading anticipated for inclusion on the September 26th Regular Voting Meeting Agenda.

Your support is appreciated as we make every effort to remain consistent changes and legal recommendations.
