Beginning Band is designed to provide students with an introductory opportunity to learn and perform on a band instrument in a homogeneous grouping (flute, oboe, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, French horn, trombone, baritone, tuba and percussion). Curriculum for this course provides an extension of the skills and concepts introduced and taught in Essential Music classes in a performance-based setting.
