Course Title: Essential Music

Length of Course: 30 cycles

Grade Level(s): 1 Periods Per Cycle: 1

Length of Period: 40 minutes

Classification: Required Total Instructional Time: 20 hours

Course Description

Students in first grade will gain an overall understanding of the basic elements of music: dynamics, melody, harmony, rhythm, instruments, tempo, meter, and timbre. They will learn how to sing with proper technique, keep a steady beat, perform simple rhythmic and melodic patterns, identify basic musical forms, and differentiate between loud and soft sounds, fast and slow tempos, and high and low pitches. These concepts will be reinforced through the use of singing games, classroom instruments, movement activities, and performance preparation.
