Budget Parameters - Expenditures

- Maintain current instructional and service programs
- Salaries / benefits
 - ▶ PSERS rate at 34.51% (current year is 33.43%)
 - Increase in healthcare rates at 3%
- Transportation contracted services
 - ▶ Increase of 2.5% in contract / 0% in fuel
- Debt service
 - Level at \$7.1 million
- All other items at 2019-20 levels

Budget Parameters - Revenues

Act I Index

SGASD Enhanced Index of 3.3%

LOCAL

- Assume current growth in AV / 3.3% increase in millage rate
- ▶ All other revenues sources 0% increase

STATE

- No increase in Basic and Special Ed Subsidies from 2019-20
- PSERS and FICA subsidy based on personnel costs

FEDERAL

No increase

Millage Rate Discussion

▶ Base Millage 2019-20 23	.6663
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- ▶ Index Limit (3.3%) <u>0.7808</u>
- Potential 2020-21 mills 24.4471

Millage Rate Discussion

3.3% increase in millage rate yields approx. \$1.3M

Property of 100,000 assessed value

Tax at 24.4471 \$2,444.71

Increase from 2019-20 \$77.75

Components of the Revenue Budget

- ▶ \$70,897,774 2.51% increase over 2019-20 year
 - Includes a 3.3% millage rate increase
 - Taxable assessed values increased by 0.54% from October
 - Revenue includes the Church & Dwight property (100%)
 - Non-real estate tax revenue increased slightly
 - No changes in Basic and Special Education subsidies
 - Other subsidies included with increases due to salary costs (Social Security and PSERS)

Components of the Expenditure Budget


- ▶ \$75,606,252 2.52% increase over this year
 - Salaries still reviewing this year's AND next year's numbers
 - PSERS increase of \$330K or 2.9% (based on newly certified rate of 34.51%)
 - Transportation increase of \$79K or 2.5% (includes Special Education services)
 - ▶ Charter school tuition increase \$200K or 16.6%

Key Points/Challenges

- **Expenditures:** Benefits, tuition (charter) costs, and contracted services grow at greater rates than revenues
- Revenues: Real estate taxes are the single largest line item – no other significant increases except through millage rate

Fund Balance

- Anticipating the 2019-2020 budget will have a slightly smaller deficit than budgeted
 - Expenditure and Revenue status for February 2020 will be an indicator of ending fund balance for the current year
 - Budget will be updated to include the Governor's proposed budget in February
- Continue fiscally responsible planning

Equalized Mills.

A district's total taxes collected are divided by its taxable market value as certified by the State Tax Equalization Board to yield the equalized mills.

A higher equalized mills ranking indicates a greater taxation effort on the part of taxpayers when compared to other school districts. High equalized mills indicate a decreased ability to raise additional funds via taxes.

Equalized mills compare the property tax burden in the school district against all other school districts in Pennsylvania.
