Course Title: Intermediate String Orchestra Length of Course: 30 cycles

Grade Level(s): 5-6 Periods Per Cycle: 3

## **Course Description**

Intermediate String Orchestra is a two-year course for students who have played string instruments in elementary school. Students will begin the study of a string instrument. Students will receive one lesson per cycle on a rotating basis. The students who demonstrate ability to play at a higher skill level will participate in orchestra class that meets twice a cycle.
